Prominent media sports personality **Terry Paine**. Terry is widely known as *Supersport's* football expert and was a Bid Ambassador in South Africa's successful 2010 World Cup campaign. Terry was a member of the England World Cup Winning squad in 1966 and earlier scored a hat-trick at Wembley. His philosophy of loyalty and consistency is demonstrated by his club record of 709 league appearances for Southampton (plus 102 Cup matches) scoring 187 goals. Penny Kimberley's experience includes formative work at the Newmarket establishments of Epsom Derby winning trainer William Haggas and the great Sir Michael Stoute. Amongst Luchelle's special skills is the all important area of feeding in which the level of sophistication has been greatly raised in recent years, drawing on the kind of expertise held by this B.Sc. graduate in Animal Science.

The Syndicate Managers

Allan Bloodlines, with over twenty years of success in bloodstock ownership, management and consultancy, has become an established player in South Africa's racing and breeding game. Fully recognising that there is much business development yet to come, the company has this icon emblazoned on all its material.



A selector of yearlings and horses in training with an extraordinary winning percentage of over 70%, Allan manages horses in training in its own and client ownership and within syndicates and racing groups. A syndicate manager for stallions in South Africa, Allan is also very active in thoroughbred breeding.

The Horses

Under Bob Ricketts' initiative, soon endorsed by Terry Paine, a plan was made to purchase four horses at the recent Bloodstock South Africa Ready to Run Sale at the TBA Complex at Germiston. Working with Penny Kimberley, a long list of several dozen potential candidates was narrowed to a much shorter list.

As the early purchases took place, whilst not premeditated, Bob's admiration of Klawervlei stallions through long association and earlier success was showing through, although Camden Park, sire of Jay Peg, was not a Klawervlei Stallion. Jay Peg is! As a result, **PREMIERSHIP RACING** is offering a team that includes youngsters by two of the finest stallions in the country – none other than **CAPTAIN AL** (holder of the record for most winners in a season - average yearling price R 370,000) and **NATIONAL EMBLEM** (sire of a list of champions – average yearling price R 310,000).



All four horses are eligible to qualify for the R 1.5 million “Ready to Run Sweepstakes” at Turffontein in November 2010. Provisional entries have been made and are included in the purchase cost.

THE INVITATION AND THE REWARDS

To become a partner in **PREMIERSHIP RACING** requires the purchase of a 10% share in the four horses. Additional shares may be purchased subject to availability and reasonable limitation.
